From the President...

To all NTxFC members:
Hello Everyone...

With AvGas costing \$6.25/gal at TKI, we're all looking for ways to stretch our flying budget - especially on those long trips where the hours add up. Here's a policy change that will help you out a little.

Effective June 1st, NTxFC will reimburse remote fuel purchases at a rate "representative of" the price of gas at TKI. In a nutshell, this means that if you buy fuel at an airport that has cheap gas, you'll pocket the savings (or most of it anyway). Here's how it works:

Each month we'll calculate a "representative" price for gas at TKI. This will be a product of the mean actual price plus a small pad for the Club (about \$.50). So if the TKI price for gas bounces between \$6.50 and \$7.00, our representative price will be \$6.25. We keep a fairly close eye on the price of gas, so we'll be able to peg this within a few cents - and the value we set for any given month will be set in cement with no room for discussion. This is to keep the bookkeeper from going crazy with people asking for what they think is the most accurate number.

When you buy gas at any remote airport, you'll make sure the Date, the Quantity in gallons, the Aircraft tail-number, and your name and member number are all on the receipt, then you'll scan/email or snail-mail the receipt to the bookkeeper within 60 days.

The bookkeeper will use the TKI Representative price instead of the actual price you paid to calculate your credit. So if the TKI Representative price is \$6.25/gal and you bought 10 gallons at \$5.50/gal (and spent \$55.00), you'd get a credit for \$62.50. Should you go on a trip and buy a total of 200 gallons at an average of \$5.50/gal (spending \$1100.00), you'd get a credit for \$1250.00. ALSO, if you buy 200 gallons at an average price of \$6.50 (spending \$1300.00), you'll still get a credit for \$1250.00. We don't see this as much of a problem since almost

everyone charges a lot less for gas than TKI.

The rules will be posted like this:

- 1) A "TKI Representative" fuel price will be set for each month by the Club President or his designee.
- 2) Receipts for remote fuel purchases must include Date of purchase, Quantity of purchase, Aircraft tail-number, and Member Name and Number. Receipts sent more than 60 days after the date of purchase will not be reimbursed.
- 3) Credit for remote fuel purchases will be calculated based on gallons purchased and the TKI Representative Price.

It's not a game-changer, but every little bit helps.

Here's another policy change - one that will most likely be appreciated by everyone in the Club in one way or another.

Effective June 1st, we'll discontinue the Discount Bucks program. This program was originally implemented for a number of reasons that have more or less panned out. However, it's been a constant source of confusion among members, and a huge convolution in our bookkeeping system.

Starting immediately, no additional Discount Bucks will be earned by anyone. Should you have a Discount Bucks balance, we'll continue to honor them through the end of August. HOWEVER this will not be automatic. You'll need to send a request to the bookkeeper by June 10 asking her to continue tracking your balance through August. Since we operate the Club as close to zero margin as possible, your cost of flying will not change in the end. Now, rather than applying a special discount to just a few hours of flying time, that same savings will be realized spread across all of your flying time.

Addison Airport - ADS



Construction of Addison airport's runway improvements are in full swing. The improvements include: full-depth pavement repairs at the north end, the south end, and the Taxiway Foxtrot intersection; a full-length asphalt overlay, followed by grooving and re-painting the runway markings; replacement of the MIRLs with HIRLs; removal of the Rwy 15 VASI; installation of PAPIs for both Rwy 15 and Rwy 33; upgrading the electrical circuits (regulators, conduit, cans, cables, etc.); and drainage and grading improvements in the lateral safety areas. Drainage and grading improvements will also be constructed along the north end of Taxiway Alpha, and there is a good possibility that we will get the MALSR (Rwy 15 approach light system) upgraded as well. Most of the runway paving work is expected to be completed by the end of June. However, grooving must wait until 30 days after the asphalt overlay is completed, and final repainting will follow the grooving.

The latest revised runway weekend closure schedule (5-24-11) is posted below. You will note, as a result of the recent rains, the contractors have added another weekend closure (June 3-6) to the original schedule.
